

If you are planning on visiting or live in our beautiful State of Florida whether you choose to ride or drive here are some facts to keep in mind:


- Obey all traffic laws, signs & signals

QUICK TIPS: Should You Ride A Motorcycle?

Riding a motorcycle is a unique experience. Riding is fun and invigorating, yet the skills needed for safe riding, combined with the lack of car-like crash protection on a motorcycle, can cast doubts on whether a person should choose to ride a motorcycle. Some potential riders lack the ability to execute skilled and timely actions in a complex traffic environment; others lack keen judgment or don't have a firm grasp of the concept of risk management.


MSF believes that motorcycling isn't for everyone. If you're considering becoming a rider, however, here are some questions for you to use as a self-assessment of the physical capabilities and mental attitude required to safely navigate a motorcycle on the street:

- 1. Are you a higher risk-taker than others you know? If you tend to need a thrill while driving a car and have aggressive or risky tendencies (following too closely, turning without signaling, talking on a cell phone, getting angry at other drivers, etc.), motorcycling may not be for you. While motorcycling improves the overall quality of life for many, for some it can lead to disaster. Thinking that accidents only happen to others is an attitude that will get you in trouble.
- 2. Can you ride a bicycle? This is a prerequisite for enrolling in our Basic *Rider Course* and generally a good gauge of your ability to maneuver a motorcycle. Bicycling, like motorcycling, is a physical activity that involves balance and coordination. And speaking of coordination ...
- 3. Can you drive a stick-shift car? This is *not* a requirement, but it may make learning to ride easier because almost all motorcycles have manual transmissions. If you can't get the hang of shifting gears but still want to enjoy a powered two-wheeler, you might want to start out on a motor scooter. Motor scooters generally have automatic transmissions and come in many sizes, from simpler models with an engine size of 50 cubic centimeters (cc) to powerful 650cc models.

- 4. Do you see well? Riding a motorcycle requires special perceptual skills that rely on good vision. Have you had an eye examination recently? Do you tend to see things that are far away later than other people you know? The ability to see well ahead is important for safe riding.
- 5. Are you mechanically inclined? Today's motorcycles are very reliable machines, but with all the bolts, nuts, and mechanisms out in the open, and only two tires connecting you to the pavement, you need to be able to inspect your equipment and make the occasional minor adjustment. You don't need to be a master mechanic, but it helps to know your way around a tire pressure gauge and a wrench. Most everything a rider needs to know is in the motorcycle owner's manual, and if you've never read your car owner's manual, that could be a sign that motorcycling is not for you.
- 6. Are you safety-minded? If you routinely find yourself bandaged up after doing simple do-it-yourself projects around the house, or think it's acceptable to operate a motor vehicle under the influence of alcohol, the unique challenges of motorcycle riding may not be compatible with your decision-making. Riders can control their situation only if safety is a high priority. Millions of motorcyclists ride millions of miles without incident, and they likely take safety seriously.
- 7. Do you respect machinery and other equipment that has risk? For example, when using a lawn mower or chainsaw, do you maintain it properly and wear eye/ear/hand protection when needed? If you're not serious about safety in connection with simple machinery and equipment whose improper use can lead to serious injury, you may not respect motorcycling enough to follow safety precautions. Successful riders know that safety isn't a matter of luck, but a matter of doing the right things to minimize risk.
- 8. Can you focus? Inattention is a major cause of crashes. Safe motorcycling requires dedicated attention to the immediate task and a keen awareness of everything going on 360 degrees around you. Rush-hour traffic aboard a motorcycle is not the place to be daydreaming. For instance, if you find yourself overusing your brakes because you were caught off-guard, or are often surprised by a passing car or truck you didn't see, your situational awareness could be less than adequate.
- 9. Can you handle your car in an emergency? Drivers don't often have the need to brake hard or swerve to miss a crash, but it's important to have the skills to be able to do so when needed. On a motorcycle, having these types of skills is essential because other highway users tend not to see motorcyclists in traffic, especially around intersections.
- 10. Are you willing to invest some time in learning to ride the right way before hopping on a bike? Your best "first ride" is a Basic *RiderCourse* where you can familiarize yourself with the safe operation of a motorcycle. You can even take the course as an experiment, to help you better understand the dynamics of good riding and to determine if motorcycling is right for you.





R.I.P. Buell Motorcycles - We'll Miss You



Friday, October 16, 2009

October 15, 2009 will be remembered as a black day in the world of motorcycling. It's almost unfathomable that after 26 years in business, American motorcycle manufacturer **Buell** is closing its doors. If it occurred, say, ten years ago I could maybe understand. But now, when Buell's at the top of its game? It's utterly ridiculous.

Historically Buell Motorcycles have always gotten a bad rap. Usually it's for their quirky attributes which have gone against the motorcycling status quo, and typically require a bit of seat time to understand. Heck, I even use to be one of those naysayer riders.

My first experience aboard a Buell was with the 2008 Buell Once SuperTT. After my first ride, I literally hated it. It was so different from every other Japanese and European sport motorcycle I had ridden and I just couldn't figure it out. Sure it handled really well, but it felt lethargic—plus I couldn't wheelie or stoppie it. After

giving mentor and Motorcycle-USA boss man, Ken Hutchison an earful of how I despised the bike, he stopped me mid-sentence to say that I simply wasn't riding it right. "Buell's are different," I recall him saying. "But once you figure out how to ride them they're actually pretty fun."

And wouldn't you know Hutchy's assessment was right on the money. I wasn't riding it right. I quickly came to terms with how to best utilize its unique performance attributes. From then on I was that guy wheeling down the 405 freeway and pulling stoppies at every stop light. Eventually, when it was time hand over the keys back to Buell, I was more than just a bit bummed.

But with the introduction of its liquid-cooled Helicon engine platform as used in the Buell 1125R SportBike and Buell 1125CR Street fighter, things suddenly changed. Buell had finally built a motorcycle that retained its eccentric character, yet at the same time offered a level of performance that was on par and, in some ways even better than its competition. Just look at the results of our **2010 Street fighter Comparison** where the 1125CR actually bested both the Ducati Street fighter and Aprilia Tuono 1000R. Now the folks from Ducati point their fingers and laugh every time they see me. Also check out how the 1125R stacked up in our **2009 Daytona SportBike Comparison**. Earlier this summer, we were invited to Buell's factory in East Troy, Wisconsin. Although we didn't know it at the time, this was literally an once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to witness how Erik Buell's dream grew from busting his knuckles inside a Wisconsin shed to its innovative East Troy factory. We also saw how its unique engineering philosophies move from a designers sketch pad, through the computer screen, and on to the finished product.





One of the things from that afternoon that really stands out in my mind is just how die-hard and passionate the entire Buell family was. From the guys hutched over their keyboards in the engineering department, to the crew in the testing department with their bullet proof safety glasses stress testing components, to the assembly line workers carefully fitting a box of kitted parts as this chunk of metal morphed into a motorcycle. They all shared one thing you could see it in their eyes: passion.

That's why it's so crazy to me that its parent company, Harley-Davidson jettisoned the pod so easily. Sure times are tough, and

Harley' key objective is its own survival, but at the same time it just doesn't make any sense pulling the plug on a fresh and innovative division, especially when its performing at an all-time high. Obviously the decision making folks at Harley never spent time aboard a Buell Motorcycle, and that's a shame.

LEGISLATIVE REPORT November 2009

Good Morning Freedom Fighters:

From ABATE of Florida, Inc.

Doc asked me to send this out to you concerning **HR 2057**, **Right to Repair Act**. He is asking you to contact your U.S. Congressman and ask them to support and co-sponsor this bill.

Modern vehicles, including motorcycles, contain advanced technology that monitors or controls virtually every function of that vehicle including: brakes, steering, air bags, fuel delivery, ignition, lubrication, theft prevention, emission controls and soon; tire pressure.

Vehicle owners and independent shops need full access to the information, parts and tools necessary to accurately diagnose, repair or re-program these systems.

Vehicle manufacturers are making access to such vital information increasingly difficult to obtain for the independent aftermarket and its customers.

Without access to critical information, parts and tools, motorists are forced to patronize new vehicle dealerships, which may not be convenient or easily accessible to vehicle owners and may increase the costs of repairs which adds a financial burden onto your household.

What the Right to Repair Act does:

1. Reaffirms the owners' right to repair their vehicle and keep their families safe.

2. Promotes consumer safety by allowing the owners and their vehicles technicians' access to the computers that control the systems and components that affect the safe operation of their vehicles.

3. Permits the owners to choose the repair shop and the replacement parts to service and maintain their vehicles.

4. Authorizes the Federal Trade Commission (FTC) to promulgate regulations to protect consumers and to promote competition in vehicle maintenance and repair

What it does not do:

1. It does not take a manufactures intellectual property.

2. It does not effect the dealer's warranty agreement with the vehicles manufactures.

3. It does not require manufactures to disclose manufacturing processes or trade secrets.

This bill is sponsored by U.S. Rep. E. Towns, (NY-10), and co-sponsored by forty-one other members of the U.S. House, and is in the Committee on Energy and Commerce. It has two Florida co-sponsors, Rep. Corrine Brown, (D-3rd) and Rep. Alcee Hastings, (D-23rd).

Once again, I urge you to support and co-sponsor HR 2057 in an effort to protect your ability to make timely and affordable repairs to your vehicles.

Additionally, Doc has asked me to monitor this new item:

Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) Launches Major Study Into Causes of Motorcycle Crashes

FHWA, Oklahoma State University to Partner on Critical Research Endeavor.

FHWA will conduct an ambitious new study to better understand and prevent motorcycle crashes, Administrator Victor Mendez announced today.

Despite years of improving highway safety and roadway fatalities at historic lows, motorcycle riders remain one of the highest-risk groups on America's roads. Nearly 5,300 motorcycle riders died in roadway crashes in 2008, accounting for 14 percent of all traffic fatalities, and 96,000 were injured.

"Having a better understanding of what causes these crashes will help us improve roadway safety for everyone," said Administrator Mendez. "Keeping people safe on America's roads is Secretary LaHood's top priority at the Department of Transportation."

The motorcycle crash causation study will be the federal government's first major in-depth analysis of motorcycle safety in nearly three decades. A provision in the "Safe, Accountable width='100%', Flexible, Efficient Transportation Act: A Legacy for Users" (SAFETEA-LU) requires the study, which will be conducted by the FHWA in partnership with the Oklahoma State University.

The university's Oklahoma Transportation Center is one of the U.S. Department of Transportation's 10 National University Transportation Centers, and it receives federal grants to conduct transportation research.

"OSU is delighted to be the lead research institution for this important study," said Dr. Allen Tree, associate dean for research in OSU's College of Engineering, Architecture and Technology. "We expect very significant and scientifically valid results to emerge from this work and look forward to a very positive final outcome."

Researchers will evaluate data from hundreds of motorcycle crashes to help identify common factors - including road configurations, environmental conditions and riding experience. The studies focus is to look look at how these factors may be affected by countermeasures that, if effectively implemented, will prevent motorcycle crashes or lessen the harm when they occur.

The National Highway Safety Administration conducted a pilot study to develop the protocols for the full-scale causation research. NHTSA was also responsible for the earlier motorcycle causation study, which was completed in 1981.

Between 1997 and 2008, motorcycle rider fatalities increased from 2,116 to 5,290 - a 150 percent jump, according to U.S. Department of Transportation's Fatality Analysis Reporting System. In 2008 alone, deaths due to motorcycle crashes rose by an estimated 2.2 percent while all other vehicle crashes saw reductions in fatalities.

Another bill has been recently filed and put on ABATE of Florida's watch list.

HB 137 was recently filed by Rep. D. Alan Hays, R-25, his district includes Lake, Seminole and Volusia counties.

HB 137 revises penalties for unlawful operation of sound making devices in motor vehicles; provides that such operation is a moving violation which includes assessment of points against driver's license; provides increased penalties for repeat violations within certain time period.

Currently, there is no mention of motorcycle tailpipes in this bill. Scribe and others are in touch with Rep. Hays seeking clarification to ensure that motorcycle tailpipes are not included in this bill.

Please do not forget that November 3rd is the General Municipal Election. Traditionally, these off-year elections see a very low voter turnout. However, I would like to see a very high "biker" presence at the polls this year, especially in Cape Coral.

We have a new U.S. Senator. His name is George LeMieux. Sen. LeMieux was appointed by Gov. Charlie Crist to fill the remainder of the term left by outgoing Sen. Mel Martinez. He was the Governor's Chief of Staff, and took the oath of office in September.






